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

Welcome to Cannes



Capital of cinema, city of stars and luxury... Cannes is known throughout the world today thanks to its International Film Festival. As the third largest town in the region in demographic terms, after Nice and Antibes, this town offers a wide variety of tourist and cultural activities. Where you can dip your feet in the sea, Cannes is a renowned seaside resort where the sun (practically) always shines. However, the town's assets do not stop there. Its history gives it a characteristic identity.

Entertainment

It is impossible to talk about Cannes without mentioning its famous Film Festival and the Palme d'Or, which became a landmark of the city. The festival which was founded in 1946, is one of the most famous cinematographic events in the world. The biggest names in the film industry appear during the second half of May. Due to the festival's attraction to people from all over the world, the town's population nearly triples during this event. The famous festival takes place mainly in the Palais des Festivals, at the end of La Croisette.

Architecture

Le Suquet is the oldest district in Cannes and it is there that you will find the old town. Perched as it is on a hilltop, the village was protected from invasion by sea. At its peak, the 11th Century castle provides a panoramic view of Cannes bay. You can also see La Tour de la Castre (Castre Tower) and a church dedicated to sailors and fishermen.

Forville Market

The main shopping street in Cannes is called the Rue d'Antibes - home to all sorts of boutiques. The town also has several markets, such as the Forville Market behind the town hall. This market offers all kinds of fresh high-quality products and it is not unusual to run into the area's chefs. The Gambetta market near the train station on the other hand offers all kinds of products from vegetables to clothing, you can also get a range of accessories to match.

Travelling to Cannes

Cannes is located on the Mediterranean coast in the French department of Alpes-Maritimes in the region of Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur. There are several ways of travelling to Cannes: by air, by sea and by land, with the quickest option being by air.

Flying to Cannes

If you prefer to fly to Nice, the nearest airport would be Nice, which is about 18 miles from Cannes. Most major cities in the world fly to Nice. A transport service runs between Nice and Cannes approximately every 30 minutes during the day. You could hire a taxi which takes about 25-30 minutes. Airport taxis ranks are located in front of the entrance doors of the Terminals 1 and 2. A helicopter service runs between Nice and Cannes and takes about half an hour.


Travelling by train to Cannes

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




