Cannes

Capital of cinema, city of stars and luxury... Cannes is known throughout the world thanks to its International Film Festival. As the third largest town in the region in demographic terms, following Nice and Antibes, this town offers a wide variety of tourist and cultural activities. With your feet dipped in the sea, Cannes is also a renowned seaside resort where the sun seems to shine every day. However, the town's assets do not stop there. Its history gives it a characteristic identity.



It is impossible to talk about Cannes without mentioning its famous Film Festival and the Palme d'Or, a veritable emblem of the town. A transport service runs between Nice and Cannes approximately every 30 minutes during the day. If you catch a taxi, it typically takes about 25-30 minutes. Airport taxi ranks are located in front of the entrance to Terminal 1 and 2 of Nice airport. A helicopter service runs between Nice and Cannes which takes about half an hour.

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



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
